4. Police Discussion
 - Youth disorder reporting figures are under survey.
 - JMack contacted a survey distributed within Clackmannan.
 - Still to be collated and outcome will be discussed at next meeting.
 - Discussion recent incident in Clackmannan High Street.
 - 5 new Police Constables to be allocated to Clackmannanshire.
 - CCTV was discussed as a record and deterrent but was run by the Council.

 - Meeting to be arranged with all concerned parties and arranged at next meeting.
5. Elected Members Report
Report received
 - Clackmannan's new 20mph is almost complete; still a bit of lining work to be done.
 - Zero Waste Scotland, which introduced a new grey wheeled bin for the collection of dry paper and card for recycling and a revised household waste collection.
 - The Council's Family Wellbeing Partnership was recognised at the COSLA Excellence Awards Ceremony last night.



- Twelve community projects have been awarded a total of £150,000.
- Tullibody Community Development Trust was awarded £10,270 to install soundproofing panels into the studio room in the Civic Centre and make it more usable.
- Still no final date for the completion of the properties in Main Street.

Report submitted

- Following an anonymous report of a vehicle being used despite being notified as off-road (SORN) a Clackmannan man's van was uplifted by the police.
- A male was robbed at knifepoint. Enquiries in this matter are ongoing.
- A police officer was assaulted on Main Street, Clackmannan.
- Following a number of vandalisms across Clackmannan a local youth will be subject of a referral to Barnados for outreach work to be completed with him.
- Since the date of the last meeting Police Scotland have received 5 calls relating to youth disorder in Clackmannan.
- Majority of speeding offences are dealt with, via fixed penalty, without a crime report being raised.
